GARLIC MUSTARD

THE DOWN AND DIRTY:

FIRST YEAR PLANTS ARE LOW-GROWING ROSETTES WITH ROUNDED, KIDNEY-SHAPED LEAVES THAT ARE SCALLOPED ON THE EDGES. LEAVES SMELL LIKE GARLIC WHEN CRUSHED. THIS PLANT QUICKLY TAKES OVER AN AREA FORMING A DENSE MAT. **WARNING: THIS PLANT IS CONSIDERED ARMED AND DANGEROUS!** IT PRODUCES CHEMICALS THAT STOP THE GROWTH OF OTHER NATIVE PLANTS AND EVEN TREES. CHEMICALS ARE ALSO TOXIC TO THE EGGS AND LARVAE OF CERTAIN BUTTERFLIES. GROWING IN FULL SUN OR SHADE, THIS PLANT IS A TRIPLE THREAT!

BATWEEK

BATS NEED TO EAT LOTS OF DIFFERENT INSECTS TO STAY HEALTHY. WHEN INVASIVE PLANTS MOVE IN, THEY PUSH OUT OUR NATIVE PLANTS. NATIVE PLANTS SUPPORT A HUGE VARIETY OF YUMMY INSECTS THAT BATS AND OTHER WILDLIFE NEED
